Health Equipment Lending Program (HELP)



There may be a time when you need some type of health equipment to assist you in your daily life. Wouldn't it be nice to be able to borrow that equipment for a short time instead of purchasing it?

Your Res Org Board is implementing a Health Equipment Lending Program to facilitate the temporary loan of equipment for use by residents of Crescent Run.

Some examples of equipment items are:

- wheelchairs
- walkers
- canes
- bath and shower benches

- toilet extenders
- bedside commodes
- bed rails
- etc.

If you have items like these and would like to help your fellow Crescent Run residents by lending your item(s) for their temporary use:

Here's how it works: Jean will compile a list of equipment lenders. When a resident needs a piece of equipment, they will contact Jean by phone, text or email stating what kind of equipment they need and for how long. Jean will then send a message to her lenders that a request has been made. If a lender responds, then Jean will give the lender the requesters contact information to facilitate the equipment delivery.

This equipment will be lent out, free of charge, for a period up to 90 days. When the resident is finished using the equipment or at the end of 90 days, they will contact the lender to either extend the loan or make arrangements to return the equipment. When the equipment is returned to the lender, it must be in good working condition and be cleaned & sanitized.

Please note that the lenders will need to fill out a liability waiver to participate in this program.

- If you moved into the park during 2022 or are not already in the 2022 Resident Directory and you want to be, send an email to <u>crresorg@gmail.com</u> and specify you want to be <u>added</u> to the 2023 Resident Directory and provide the following information:
 - Resident #1 Full Name & Phone Number
 - Resident #2 Full Name & Phone Number
 - Your Lot #
 - Optional --- Home State


